

#### **TIDBITS AND TRIVIA**

- \* In 1791, our founding father and first U.S. president, George Washington chose the site where the White House would be built and approved its final design. However, he passed prior to living in the "presidential palace."
- \* George Washington was in the whiskey business. He had a distillery at Mount Vernon, which produced 11,000 gallons of whiskey a year. He was the largest producer at that time in America. He was also a tall drink of water. He stood at 6 feet, 2 inches.
- \* The White House was the country's biggest house until after the Civil War. It has 132 rooms and 35 bathrooms on six levels, as well as 412 doors, 147 windows, 28 fireplaces, 8 staircases, and 3 elevators. The building and grounds are sprawled across 18 acres.
- \* Although it's been the official residence of all U.S. presidents since 1800, the building wasn't formally deemed the "White House" until President Theodore Roosevelt used it on his stationary in 1901.
- \* William Henry Harrison, who was our nineth president, was the only president to study to be a doctor.
- \* Ulysses S. Grant was given a \$20.00 speeding ticket for riding his horse and buggy too fast down a street in Washington D.C.
- \* The White House's first website went online in October of 1994.
- \* The Fourth of July is a date on which three presidents died. John Adams and Thomas Jefferson (in 1826) and James Monroe (in 1831). It's also the birthdate of Calvin Coolidge.
- \* Rutherford Hayes was the first president to have a telephone and a typewriter in the White House.
- \* Mary Todd Lincoln held a séance in the Red Room of the White House.
- \* A White House staff member, Charles Reeder, once snuck Algonquin, a pony that belonged to Theodore Roosevelt's children, up the White House elevator to visit Archie Roosevelt while he was sick in bed with the measles.
- \* Gerald Ford was a model for Cosmopolitan magazine. He appeared on the magazine cover in 1942, and he met his wife through modeling.
- \* Theodore Roosevelt had a lock of Abe Lincoln's hair.

Incidentally, during his inauguration, Teddy Roosevelt wore a ring that contained a lock of President Lincoln's hair

- \* Richard Nixon proposed to his wife the day they met.
- \* George H.W. Bush considered Clint Eastwood as his running mate.
- \* The first turkey pardon was by President John F. Kennedy.
- \* Rutherford B. Hayes was the first president to host the Easter egg roll.
- \* There was an assignation attempt on FDR's life. In 1933, a would-be assassin shot at Franklin Roosevelt five times while he was giving a speech. Five people were hit. None of them were FDR.
- \* Ronald Reagan wrote about Drew Barrymore in his diary. "She's a nice little person." He was offered a role in "Back to the Future." President Reagan also convinced Mr. T to play Santa at the White House.
- \* Jimmy Carter wrote a children's book called The Little Baby Snoogle-Fleejer. The storyline was about a young boy growing up in poverty who meets an unusual deep-sea creature.
- \* Dwight Eisenhower named Camp David after his grandson. Prior to that, the retreat was called Shangri-La.
- \* Bill Clinton's first job was selling comic books. He made \$100.00.
- \* Andrew Johnson was a tailor before launching his presidential career. He made all of his own clothing.
- \* Lyndon B. Johnson proposed to Lady Bird with a \$2.50 ring from Sears.
- \* Ulysses S. Grant's middle initial stood for nothing. Apparently, it came from a typo on his application to West Point.
- \* Three presidents married while in office. President John Tyler remarried in 1844 after the death of his first wife. Woodrow Wilson also remarried after the death of his wife in 1915. Prior to his wedding, Grover Cleveland was one of two White House bachelors. The other was James Buchanan, who never married. Cleveland was also the only U.S. President to marry in a White House ceremony.

Scammers will often insist you pay in a way that makes it hard to get your money back — by wire transfers, gift cards, cryptocurrency, or a payment app. Anyone who insists that you can only pay that way is a scammer. Hang up!
